## Capitalize on a holiday -

- -Decorate the hallway(s),
- -Posters/signs in the cafeteria,
- -Announcement over the PA and ad/article in the school paper,
- -Have the Spanish Club "teach" a phrase "Happy..Day ..." in halls before class

-(with permission) Distribute a safe (no nuts) "treat" taped to a card w/ a "Happy (Holiday) greeting on one side and a benefit of language statement on reverse – perhaps the Spanish Club could do this at a sports/theater/concert event

-Scavenger Hunt – students search for language related items found in other classrooms (w/ teacher collaboration)

-a Language FAIR



### **INTEGRATE!**

-Visit another class (w/ teacher collaboration) to share language & culture knowledge related to a topic the class is studying, e. g., Mexico/The Pearl or a geography lesson. (A Latin class could explain abbreviations like "i.e.", etc.)

-Develop a culinary/culture activity with Family and Consumer Science classes.

-Create an interdisciplinary unit

Choose a common topic and collaborate with teachers of other disciplines to demonstrate how knowledge of another language/culture enriches our life. Possible themes:

"The Roaring Twenties"

"The Dynamic Sixties"



PUBLICIZE and Create good PR!

All of these activities are newsworthy! Contact the media.

Invite the Faculty and Administrators, the School Board, a community guest, etc.

## **Guest Speakers in the school and community**

Invite a former student who has benefitted from knowing a second language, a businessman whose work has a need for bi-lingual employees, a parent, a Health Care worker, someone in the military, etc. ... to speak about the need for people with second language and culture skills.

## In our community

Multicultural Day or Fair

Have a booth and offer expressions in a language or two.

Adapt one or more of the school activities.

Students could attend a community theater performance or a concert; participate in a parade or a Little League game and distribute the "treat cards".

Place a bi-or tri-lingual poster in store windows on holidays.

Make a sign/poster with "Hello" or "Welcome" in many languages to place in area businesses.

Ask a local theater to show a foreign film.

A proclamation

Ask the mayor to proclaim National Foreign Language Week – arrange for media coverage.
